HOLY FAMILY SENIOR SCHOOL TOTALLY ROCKED IN NATIONAL TIMES TABLES COMPETITION

The pupils and staff at Holy Family Senior School are incredibly excited to announce that they came 29th place in Ireland Rocks - a times tables competition run by the internationally renowned, award-winning app and learning platform, Times Tables Rock Stars.



Ireland Rocks required children to correctly answer as many multiplication and division questions as possible, to give their class and school the best chance of winning.

The competition was fierce with 12,157,817 questions answered collectively by 15,635 pupils from more than 281 schools and 1,072 classes around the country!

Our school stats were astonishing too. On average our top class Ms. Dooley's, answered 3420 questions correctly per pupil, with the best-performing pupil Evan Branagan answering an amazing 7,698 questions correctly in total!! Ms. Dooley's class ranked number 15 out of the 982 classes that took part. We are very proud of everyone who took part!
